PATHWAY TO WRITING SERIES 2018

OVERVIEW

The Pathway to Writing Series is a professional learning series for teachers and support staff (AIEOs, EAs and SAER coordinators) who wish to expand their knowledge and skills in implementing effective oral language instruction and intervention in their classrooms to support the development of writing for students with a language learning difficulty. Participants attending this series must work within either the North East Metropolitan or Wheatbelt Education Region.

STRUCTURE

This course consists of 3 full days of professional learning in Term 1. Throughout the series, participants are provided with ongoing support and mentoring from the Outreach Service. This support may include collaborative data analysis, goal setting, planning and resources sharing; and classroom support, including classroom observation, modelling and coaching. Between sessions participants engage in action research (including trialling of activities or strategies and professional readings and reflections). Following the 3 professional learning days, all participants will be provided with an observation (in person or by video) and coaching session with a member of the Outreach Team.

CONTENT AND SESSION DATES

The PtW Series is structured to include a balance between theory and practice, with regular opportunities for video observations, NEMLDC classroom observations, resource exploration and collaborative planning.

The 3 sessions will focus on the development of oral language into writing and explore a range of evidence based assessment and intervention approaches for the following language areas:
